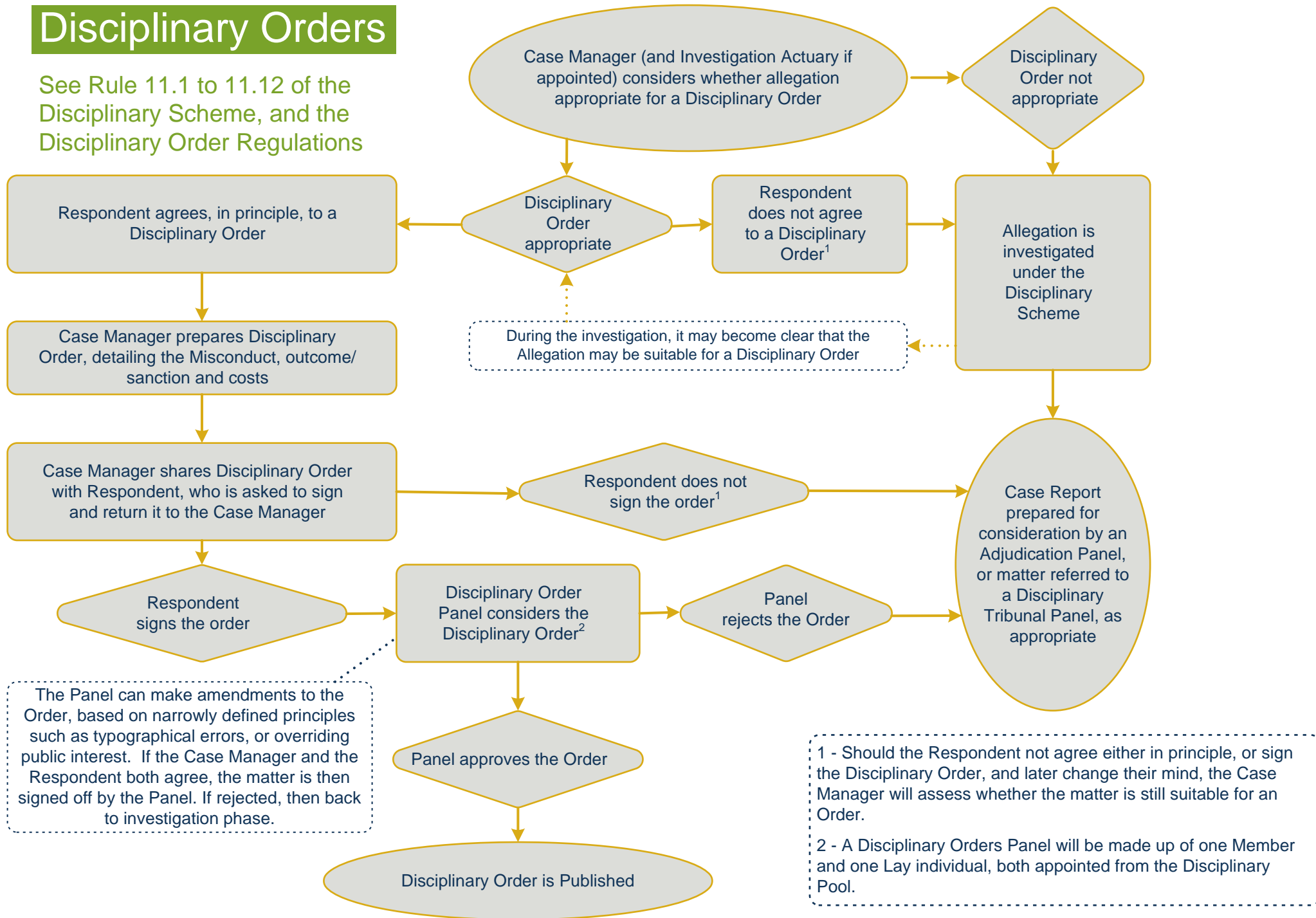


Disciplinary Orders

See Rule 11.1 to 11.12 of the Disciplinary Scheme, and the Disciplinary Order Regulations



The Panel can make amendments to the Order, based on narrowly defined principles such as typographical errors, or overriding public interest. If the Case Manager and the Respondent both agree, the matter is then signed off by the Panel. If rejected, then back to investigation phase.

1 - Should the Respondent not agree either in principle, or sign the Disciplinary Order, and later change their mind, the Case Manager will assess whether the matter is still suitable for an Order.

2 - A Disciplinary Orders Panel will be made up of one Member and one Lay individual, both appointed from the Disciplinary Pool.
