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Introduction

In support of the aims of our Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) Strategy, we have an ongoing commitment to annually collate and publish the aggregate DEI demographic data of our key boards.

Collating DEI demographic data from our key boards at the same time provides a consistent and comprehensive dataset and enables the IFoA to monitor and report progress over time. This is the second year of reporting this set of DEI demographics for our key boards (n.b. A smaller range of DEI demographics were first published in our 2021/22 Annual Report).

We want to sincerely thank all our board members who took part in this exercise. The responses provide valuable detail which will inform our work and progress against the IFoA's DEI strategy. We will continue to repeat this exercise each year and track our ongoing progress.

DEI data survey

The diversity, equity and inclusion (DEI) demographic data survey was issued to members of the IFoA Council, Management Board, Regulatory Board and Executive Leadership Team (ELT) on 16 February 2024 and remained open for nearly 2 weeks, closing on 29 February 2024.

The survey gathered data on the broad range of DEI demographics that were first collated in 2023 and was designed in a way that any board member would only have to fill out the survey once. The survey was voluntary and anonymous, and carried out in line with GDPR requirements. Answers to the survey have been treated in the strictest of confidence and all responses anonymised. All questions were optional to answer and included the choice to respond 'prefer not to say'. Where there were fewer than three responses to answer options, the data is protected and therefore not reported.

Results

There were 36 responses to the survey, an overall response rate of 65% of key board members (response rates varied by individual board, and slightly by question. These are reported in the sections below). The headline analysis of the findings is summarised below. All response rates are rounded to the nearest whole number. A copy of the survey issued can be found in the appendix.


DEI demographic breakdown of IFoA Council

The sections below set out the findings from IFoA Council for each of the questions asked in the IFoA's 2024 DEI demographics survey.

There were 19 responses to each of the questions (63% of all IFoA Council members surveyed). Where there were fewer than three responses to answer options, the data is protected and not reported.

Sex

Question one asked 'What is your sex?' 58% of respondents stated their sex as 'male' with 42% stating 'female'



Gender identity

Question two asked 'Is the gender you identify with the same as the sex you were registered with at birth?' 89% of respondents said 'yes'. Responses for those who indicated 'no' or 'prefer not to answer' are not reported.

Disability or long-term health condition

Question three asked 'Do you consider yourself to have a disability or long-term health condition?' 100% of respondents said 'no'.


Neurodivergent conditions

Question four asked 'Do you consider yourself to have a neurodivergent condition, such as Attention Deficit (Hyperactivity) Disorder or AD(H)D, Autism spectrum (including Asperger's Syndrome), Dyslexia, Dyspraxia (DCD), Dyscalculia, Tourette's syndrome?' (Please note this list is not exhaustive).

68% of respondents said 'no' they did not have a neurodivergent condition, with 16% of respondents not knowing. Those respondents saying 'yes' they had a neurodivergent condition, or preferred not to answer the question, are not reported.

Age range

Question five asked 'What age are you?' 16% of respondents were aged 36-45, 53% of respondents were in the 46-55 age range and 21% were aged 56-65. Responses in other age ranges are not reported.



Global region

Question six asked 'Please select the global region you live in from the list below'. 79% of respondents stated the UK as the global region in which they live. All other global regions, and those who responded 'prefer not to answer', are not reported.

Ethnicity

Question seven asked 'Which of the following best describes your ethnicity?' 58% of respondents stated their ethnicity as 'White' (including White: English, Welsh, Scottish, Northern Irish or British, White: Irish, White: Gypsy or Irish Traveller, White: Roma, and White: Other). 16% of respondents stated their ethnicity as 'Black' (including Black British, Black Caribbean, Black African, and any other Black, Black British or Caribbean background). 16% of respondents stated their ethnicity as 'Asian or Asian British' (including Indian, Pakistani, Bangladeshi, Chinese, any other Asian background). Mixed or multiple ethnic groups, other ethnic groups or those who prefer to use another term, and those who responded 'prefer not to answer', are not reported.

Religion or belief

Question eight asked 'Which of the following best describes your religion or belief? 47% of respondents stated described their religion or belief as 'Christian', with 26% selecting 'no religion or belief'. All other religions or beliefs, and those who responded 'prefer not to answer', are not reported.

Sexual orientation


Question nine asked 'Which of these terms best describes your sexual orientation?' 79% of respondents described their sexual orientation as 'heterosexual/straight'. All other definitions of sexual orientation, and those who responded 'prefer not to answer', are not reported.

Occupation of main household earner at the age of 14

Question 10 asked 'What was the occupation of your main household earner when you were about 14?' 42% of respondents were from 'modern professional and traditional professional' backgrounds, and a further 32% from 'senior, middle or junior manager' occupations. All other socioeconomic occupation groupings, and those who responded 'prefer not to answer', are not reported.

School attended between the ages of 11 and 16

Question 11 asked 'What type of school did you attend for the most time between the ages of 11 and 16?' 32% of respondents attended a state run/state-funded school, with 26% attending a fee paying or independent school and a further 32% attending school outside of the UK. Responses for 'attended fee paying school with 90% or more bursary', 'I don't know' and 'prefer not to answer' are not reported.




Eligibility for free school meals (UK only) post-1980

Question 12 asked 'If you attended school in the UK and finished school after 1980, were you eligible for free school meals at any point during your school years?' 42% of respondents said 'no, they were not eligible and a further 47% said it was 'not applicable'. Responses for 'yes', 'I don't know' and 'prefer not to answer' are not reported.


Parents attending university and gaining degrees

Question 13 asked 'Did either of your parents attend university and gain a degree by the time you were 18? 58% of respondents said 'no' and 42% said 'yes'.



Professional qualifications

Question 14 asked 'Are you the first in your family to gain a professional qualification?'. 47% of respondents said 'yes' and 53% said 'no'.




DEI demographic breakdown of IFoA Management Board

Here are the findings from the IFoA's Management Board for each of the DEI demographic questions asked in the IFoA's 2024 DEI demographics survey.

There was a total of seven responses to questions (88% of IFoA Management Board members surveyed). Where there were fewer than three responses to answer options, the data is protected and not reported.

Sex

Question one asked 'What is your sex?' 57% of respondents stated their sex as 'male' and 43% as 'female'




School attended between the ages of 11 and 16


Eligibility for free school meals (UK only) post-1980


Parents attending university and gaining degrees

Question 14 asked 'Are you the first in your family to gain a professional qualification?' 43% of respondents said 'yes' and 57% said 'no'.




DEI demographic breakdown of IFoA Regulatory Board

Here are the findings from IFoA Regulatory Board for each of the DEI demographic questions asked in the IFoA 2024 DEI demographics survey.

There were 10 responses to each of the questions (91% of all IFoA Regulation Board members surveyed). Where there were fewer than three responses to answer options, the data is protected and not reported.

Sex

Question one asked 'What is your sex?' 70% of respondents stated 'male' with 30% stating 'female'.



Gender identity

Question two asked 'Is the gender you identify with the same as the sex you were registered with at birth?' 100% of respondents said 'yes'.

Disability or long-term health condition

Question three asked 'Do you consider yourself to have a disability or long-term health condition?' 90% of respondents said they did not have a disability or long-term health condition. Question 10 asked 'What was the occupation of your main household earner when you were about 14?' 50% of respondents are from 'modern professional and traditional professional' backgrounds. All other socio-economic occupation groupings, and those who responded 'prefer not to answer' are not reported.

School attended between the ages of 11 and 16.

Question 11 asked 'What type of school did you attend for the most time between the ages of 11 and 16?' 60% of respondents attended a state run/state-funded school and 30% of respondents 'attended school outside of the UK'. Responses for 'Attended a fee paying or independent school', 'Attended fee paying school with 90% or more bursary', 'I don't know' and 'Prefer not to answer' are not reported.

Eligibility for free school meals (UK only) post-1980

Question 12 asked 'If you attended school in the UK and finished school after 1980, were you eligible for free school meals at any point during your school years? 60% of respondents said 'no, they were not eligible' and a further 30% said it was 'not applicable'. Responses for 'yes', 'I don't know' and 'prefer not to answer' are not reported.

Parents attending university and gaining degrees

Question 13 asked 'Did either of your parents attend university and gain a degree by the time you were 18? 40% of respondents said 'no' and 40% said 'yes'. Those who responded 'don't know' or 'prefer not to answer' are not reported.

Professional qualifications

Question 14 asked 'Are you the first in your family to gain a professional qualification?'. 30% of respondents said 'yes' and 50% said 'no'. Those who stated, 'I do not have a professional qualification', 'Don't know' or 'Prefer not to answer' are not reported.


DEI demographic breakdown of IFoA Executive Leadership Team



Eligibility for free school meals (UK only) post-1980

Question 12 asked 'If you attended school in the UK and finished school after 1980, were you eligible for free school meals at any point during your school years? 67% of respondents said 'no, they were not eligible. Responses for 'yes', 'I don't know', 'Not applicable' and 'Prefer not to answer' are not reported.

Parents attending university and gaining degrees

Question 13 asked 'Did either of your parents attend university and gain a degree by the time you were 18? 50% of respondents said 'no' and 50% said 'yes'.

Professional qualifications

Question 14 asked 'Are you the first in your family to gain a professional qualification?'. 67% said 'No'. Those who stated, 'Yes', 'I do not have a professional qualification', 'Don't know' or 'Prefer not to answer' are not reported.
